GO WEST

Nestled along the Nebraska border in southeastern Wyoming, Goshen County is the gateway to the West, where covered wagons once rumbled across the open prairies on the Oregon, Mormon Pioneer, Texas, Cheyenne Deadwood, Pony Express, and California trails. Many pioneers moved west, hoping to own land and start fresh. Traces of the paths they took can still be seen today, with wheel tracks and names carved into stone. Today Goshen County is known for its history, hunting, recreation, and agriculture.

GO BACK IN TIME

At the Homesteads Museum, you will learn the stories of pioneers and early residents. This attraction is housed in the historic Union Pacific train depot and boasts the county's first automobile. Walk the grassy grounds to see vintage train cars, antique farm equipment, a turn-of-the-century homestead shack, and a one-room schoolhouse, along with many other treasures. See exhibits, photographs, interactive displays, and Goshen County's early artifacts. Enjoy Seasonal attractions like the Terror Train Escape Room, Afternoon at the Boo-seum, the Polar Express, rotating Smithsonian displays, and historical presentations.

Take in views of dramatic bluffs set against the backdrop of sprawling reservoirs here in Goshen County. Whether you're sunbathing on a sandy beach, casting a fishing line, boating, or enjoying a picnic lunch—the views of our 90 bodies of water are breathtaking. Consider a trek along 30 walk-in hunting and fishing areas and over 5,600 acres of Wildlife Habitat Area. Keep an eye out for white-tailed deer, cottontail rabbits, bald and golden eagles, ring-necked pheasants, beavers, and more! If you love bird watching, we have over 275 sightings of different species of birds here in Goshen County!

Visit Ellis' Harvest Home, let little ones loose in the fresh air as they run through the hay maze, navigate the twists and turns of the corn maze, enjoy the petting zoo, jumping pillow, find the perfect pumpkin, and so much more. Goshen is a county rich in history. With historical landmarks and monuments to explore, visitors can experience firsthand the history of Wyoming and westward expansion through immersive and onsite learning. Dive into the heritage of pioneers and early residents. Goshen County is home to the Oregon Trail Historic Byway, more than 60 historical markers and memorials, and plenty of natural beauty. Feel at ease as you stand on historic land and watch wild geese soar through clear skies, lumbering cattle graze in pastures, and the sunset against an endless horizon with fields of corn and hay as far as the eye can see.

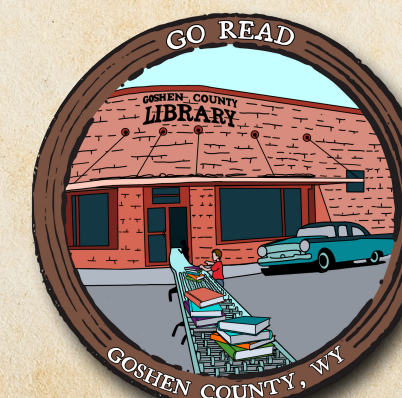

GO EXPERIENCE

At the Fort Laramie National Historic Site, guests can stroll the grounds once walked by fur trappers, Native Americans, missionaries, pioneers, miners, and soldiers. Originally established as a fur trading post in 1834, this site eventually became the largest military post on the Northern Plains. Take the audio tour to explore at your own pace. While you're there, catch a live reenactment, have the kiddos participate in the Fort Laramie Junior Ranger Program, or head over to the 1883 Soldiers Bar, which serves root beer, sarsaparilla, cream soda, and birch beer during special holidays and select weekends.
